‘Ecology of community: Māori understandings and values in relation to spatial data’

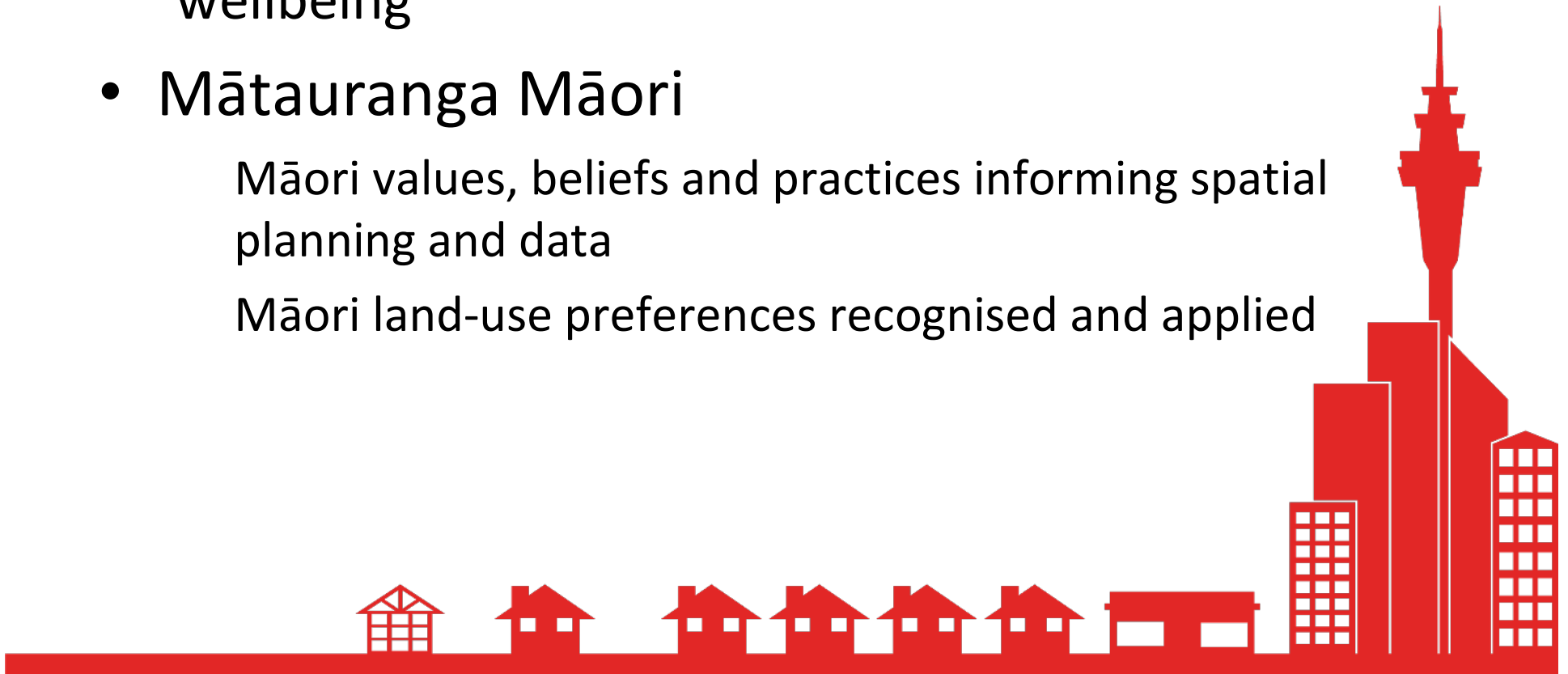
•Research aims

- Develop and draft cadastral legislation to enable Māori land-right preferences to be accommodated within the current cadastral system



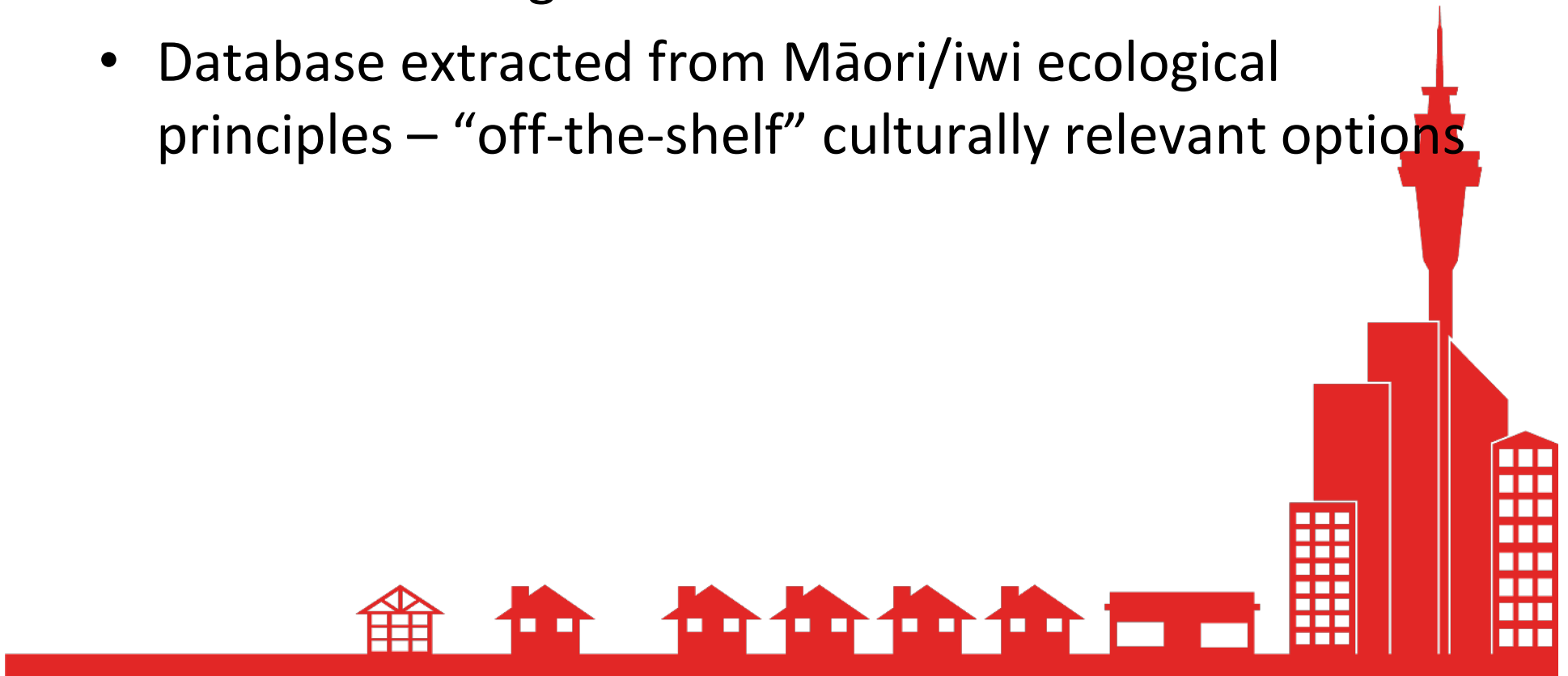
Vision Mātauranga objectives
